## GRADE 10 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

**Geometry/Wilson Hill Academy:** Online class taught by Leslie Smith of Wilson Hill Academy using the text *Geometry* by Jurgensen, Brown, and Jurgensen. This proof-based course covered the required concepts of Euclidean geometry including definitions, postulates, and theorems. Areas of study included angles, parallel lines, congruent and similar triangles, polygons, circles and arcs, and area and volume. Special topics covered include coordinate geometry, introductory trigonometry, and constructions.

Clive also studied with a private tutor at Mathnasium, a math learning center in Baton Rouge. Their program follows state and Common Core math standards and is tailored to Clive's levels of mastery in each particular area of mathematics. He received between two and three hours of direct, one-on-one instruction a week.

**British Literature:** Under his mother's guidance Clive studied and responded to some of the greatest works of British literature, including Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice*, the essays of Thomas Carlyle, and the poetry of William Blake, following the syllabus in *Lightning Literature and Composition: Early – Mid 19<sup>th</sup> Century* by Michael G. Gaunt. He attended a big-screen viewing of London's National Theatre production of *Hamlet* after participating in a weeklong intensive online course focused on the play. Clive also participated in another weeklong intensive online course examining *Sir Gawain and the Green Knight*, studied the poetry of John Donne, and read *The Invisible Man* by H.G. Wells.

**Biology I:** Clive worked through the CK-12 high school biology text ([www.ck12.org](http://www.ck12.org)) along with its accompanying workbook, tests, and quizzes, under his mother's guidance. CK-12 Biology covers cell biology, genetics, evolution, ecology, microorganisms, fungi, plants, invertebrates, vertebrates, and physiology.

For labs he followed the *Illustrated Guide to Home Biology Experiments* by Robert Bruce Thompson and Barbara Fritchman Thompson, correlated to the CK-12 curriculum by the author, with the Home School Biology Kit from The Home Scientist ([www.thehomescientist.com](http://www.thehomescientist.com)). When needed, an experienced tutor assisted Clive with labs.

**Latin II/Anne Van Fossen:** Online class taught by Anne Van Fossen of Classical Learning Resource Center ([www.clrconline.com](http://www.clrconline.com)) using the Oxford Latin Course Part II (2<sup>nd</sup> edition). Latin II covers the fourth and fifth declension, many more uses of the Latin cases, interrogative and indefinite pronouns and adjectives, comparative and superlative adjectives, all six tenses of the indicative mood, participles, and the passive voice.

**World History/William Hogan:** Clive was selected to attend Northwestern University's ADVANCE program for gifted students, where he took Professor William Hogan's Age of Empires course, a broad-based survey of world history and the development of human society.
